



Caramelised banana



Ingredients

Bananas


A small wedge of butter

¼ cup brown sugar

Cinnamon (optional)

1. Cut the bananas into small wedges. You do not need a sharp knife for this, a bread and butter knife will do.
2. Pour the sugar across the bottom of the saucepan. Then sprinkle a little cinnamon in if you want.
3. Place the bananas on top of the sugar and turn the stove to medium heat. Be careful not to touch the saucepan as it gets hot (please make sure there is an adult around for this bit).
4. Add the butter, enough to make sure the bananas don't stick to the pan.
5. Turn the bananas over and coat them with the sugar mixture. The sugar will slowly turn into caramel.
6. Let the mixture cool a little bit, but you could eat the bananas warm. They should be gooey, sticky, delicious and sweet.


